


Proper use of electronic resources

Mass downloading in a short time and ID sharing are serious contract violations.



Strictly no mass downloading



- Automated operations by programs / bulk downloading
- Rapid consecutive clicking in a short time (not allowed even if done manually)
- Access generated by browser prefetching functions
- Copying, redistribution, or any use beyond personal use

High-volume, short-term access



Risk of campus-wide access suspension!

Please re-check the settings of reference management tools and your browser.



- Make sure to turn OFF auto-retrieval functions in EndNote, RefWorks, Mendeley, Zotero, Papers, etc.
- Turn OFF prefetching/prerendering features in web browsers such as Edge, Chrome, Safari, Firefox, etc.

Lending IDs/passwords is prohibited.



- Strictly manage your ECS-ID / SPS-ID
- Lending your ID to others or using someone else's ID is prohibited under the "Kyoto University Information System Usage Regulations."

Examples of unintentional "mass access" incidents:

Case 1

Dividing downloading work among a group

Lab members split downloads, triggering short-term concentrated access.



Leave time between downloads and retrieve only what you need.

Case 2

Viewing abstracts consecutively

Sequentially opening HTML abstracts and full texts may still count as "downloading," even without PDFs.



Search in abstract databases (e.g., Web of Science)

Case 3

Auto-retrieval functions in tools

"Automatic PDF import" was ON in the reference manager, triggering repeated high-volume background access.



Turn OFF automatic retrieval settings immediately

Case 4

Physical accidents

A book held down F5 (refresh), logging hundreds of accesses in minutes.



Be careful around your PC when you step away
